#### India's Q1 **GDP Surprises** Positively



New Delhi: India's GDP growth for Q1 2025-26 surged to 7.8 per cent, exceeding expectations and highlighting the resilience of the economy, according to Rajiv Memani. President of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII). The growth is significantly higher than 6.5 per cent recorded in the same quarter last year. Key sectors driving the expansion include agriculture (3.7%), construction (7.6%), and manufacturing (7.7%). Memani credited stable policies, government reforms, and a near 20% increase in government expenditure for sustaining growth. He noted India's position as the fastestgrowing major economy, underscoring its rising prominence in the global

#### Trump Cancels India Visit for Quad

economic order.



New York: US President Donald Trump has reportedly cancelled his plans to visit India for the Quad Summit later this year, according to The New York Times. The report highlights deteriorating relations between Trump and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, worsened by Trump's repeated claims of having "solved" the India-Pakistan conflict. Tensions escalated during a June 17 phone call, when Trump suggested Modi nominate him for Pakistan's Nobel Peace Prize, which Modi rejected.

#### "Human GPS" Terrorist Killed Jammu Kashmir

Srinagar: Security forces on Saturday killed Bagu Khan, widely known as the "human GPS" of terror networks. in Gurez, Jammu and Kashmir. Also referred to as Samandar Chacha, Bagu had been based in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) since 1995 and was one of the most prolific facilitators of crossborder infiltration. He was shot dead alongside another terrorist during an infiltration attempt from Nowshera Naar. Authorities say Bagu was responsible for planning and guiding nearly 100 infiltration bids over the years, making him a key figure in terror operations along the Line of Control.

## CHINA ROLLS OUT RED CARPET FOR MODI

Tianjin: Prime Minister

Narendra Modi received a warm and rousing welcome upon his arrival in China on Saturday, marking his first visit to the country in over seven years. The trip carries heightened significance amid the recent downturn in India-US relations, triggered by President Donald Trump's tariff policies, which have affected global trade and economic stability. Modi arrived in Tianjin from Japan, concluding the second and final leg of his two-nation tour. He is set to attend the annual summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) on August 31 and September 1. During the summit, Modi is expected to hold bilateral discussions with Chinese President Xi Jinping on Sunday, a meeting that assumes added importance in



light of ongoing geopolitical and economic challenges. The two leaders are likely to review India-China economic ties and explore ways to further normalise relations, which

have been strained since the 2020 border clashes in eastern Ladakh.

The SCO summit will also bring together Russian President Vladimir Putin, host Xi Jinping, and leaders from Belarus, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan. Dialogue partners and observers will also participate. India has been a full member of the

SCO since 2017, after serving as an observer from 2005. Over the years, India has chaired the SCO Council of Heads of Government in 2020 and the SCO Council of Heads of State

from 2022 to 2023. Ahead of his trip, Modi highlighted the importance of stable bilateral relations with China in ensuring global peace and economic stability. In an interview with

bun, he said, "Given the current volatility in the world economy, it is also important for India and China, as two major economies, to work together to bring stability to the world economic order."

The visit follows Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi's recent trip to India, where he held wideranging discussions with External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and National Security Advisor Ajit Doval. The talks resulted in several measures aimed at building a "stable, cooperative, and forward-looking" bilateral relationship. These measures include joint maintenance of peace along the contested frontier, reopening border trade, and resuming direct flight services between the two countries at the earliest opportunity.

## 11 DEAD IN J&K LANDSLIDES, CLOUDBURST

**Growing India** 

New Delhi: At least 11 people, including seven from one family, were killed in separate cloudburst and landslide incidents in the remote Reasi and Ramban districts of Jammu and Kashmir, as the Union Territory reels from two weeks of relentless natural disasters.

Since 14 August, J&K has been bursts and landslides, claiming 130 lives and injuring 140 people across the region. Thirty-two pilgrims remain missing. The pilgrimage to the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine atop Trikuta Hills in Reasi has been suspended for the fifth consecutive day following a landslide earlier this week that killed 34 pilgrims halfway along the 12-km trek from Katra.

Chief minister Omar Abdullah expressed profound grief over the devastating landslide in Reasi's Bhadder village that claimed seven lives from a single family. Amid relentless heavy rains, he urged residents to remain alert, steer clear of vulner-



able areas, and strictly follow safety advisories.

Abdullah has ordered district authorities and disaster management teams to conduct roundthe-clock monitoring, swiftly evacuate those in high-risk zones, and ensure immediate relief reaches affected families. He also called on all departments to stay vigilant, coordinate seamlessly, and take every possible step to protect lives as the severe weather continues.

Reasi tragedy:

Early Saturday, a landslide flattened a house in Badder vil-

lage, Reasi district, killing seven members of the same family. The deceased were identified as Nazir Ahmad (38), his wife Wazira Begum (35), and their children Bilal Ahmed (13), Mohd Mustafa (11), Mohd Adil (8), Mohd Mubarak (6), and Mohd Wasim (5). Nazir and his family were asleep when the house, located on a hill slope, was buried under debris. Locals initially searched the site before police teams retrieved the bodies.

Ramban disaster:

In Ramban district, a cloudburst struck the mountainous

Rajgarh area around 11:30 pm on Friday, damaging two houses and a school, and triggering flash floods. Four people died: Ashwani Sharma (24), his brother Dwarka Nath (55), niece Virta Devi (26), and guest Om Raj (38). Sharma's sister-in-law, Bidya Devi (55), is still missing. Rescuers, including local volunteers, police, and the SDRF, recovered the bodies after a strenuous

"The cloudburst created a fast-flowing stream that swept away houses, a cowshed, and the school building," said local resident Ajay Kumar. He praised the district administration and local volunteers for their rapid response. Officials, including deputy commissioner Mohammad Alyas Khan and SSP Arun Gupta, are overseeing rescue and relief operations. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has urged citizens to remain vigilant and avoid risk-prone areas, while instructing government departments to maintain close coordination to protect lives amid ongoing heavy

## No permanent friends or enemies; only permanent interests

New Delhi: Amid US President Donald Trump's tariff threats. Defence Minister Kajnath Singh on Saturday underlined that in international relations there are "no permanent friends or enemies, only permanent

interests.' He stated that India will continue to protect the interests of its farmers and citizens, and its position will remain "unchanged" regardless of external "pressure." "This vision will keep us secure in the future and will give us a prominent position in the emerging powers of the world. This vision is being reflected in our every decision. In the swiftly changing world, the so-called devel-

oped countries are showing a form of protectionism, and the trade and tariff war is getting serious," Defence Minister Singh said while addressing the NDTV De fence Summit 2025. The remarks came in response to Trump's announcement of a 50 per cent tariff on Indian goods, blaming what he described as unfair trade practices and New Delhi's refusal to halt the import of Russian crude oil. Referring to Edmund Burke, who had described the East India Company as "a state in the guise of a merchant," Defence Minister Singh noted, "Today, the way the state is working like the merchants, his quote is changed a bit and has become a merchant in the guise of the state."

## RCB GIVES 25L AID TO STAMPEDE VICTIMS' KIN

New Delhi: The Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) have announced Rs 25 lakh in financial aid to the families of the 11 victims who lost their lives in a stampede on June 4, during celebrations of the team's maiden Indian Premier League (IPL) victory. The stampede occurred outside the M Chinnaswamy Stadium, where over 2,50,000 people gathered to celebrate RCB's historic win. This compensation comes nearly three months after RCB had ini-



tially provided Rs 10 lakh to each family, a day after the tragedy. The team had also launched the "RCB Cares" initiative on June

5, a fund intended to support the victims of the stampede. In an emotional statement posted on Saturday, RCB said, "Our

hearts broke on 4 June, 2025. We lost eleven members of the RCB family. Their absence will echo in the memories of each one of us." The franchise added that the Rs 25 lakh aid was a first step in their ongoing commitment to show compassion and care. Two days earlier, on August 28, RCB posted for the first time in almost three months, saying, "The Silence wasn't Absence. It was Grief." The team acknowledged how 4 June had changed everything, and that the silence since then was a way of holding space for the loss.

## CM calls cabinet meeting tomorrow, a day before Assembly session

Jaipur: Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma has convened a crucial cabinet meeting on Sunday, ahead of the Assembly session scheduled to begin on Monday. The meeting, to be held at the Chief Minister's Office, is expected to focus on legislative business and final preparations for the session.

According to party leaders, some important bills are likely to be taken up in the meeting. The re-Rajasthan High cent Court decision on the cancellation of the SI recruitment exam may also come up for informal discussion in the meeting. However, the Cabinet Secretariat has only released information about the meeting so far, and the detailed agenda is likely to be issued on Sunday morning. Three pending bills are already scheduled to be referred to the Select Committee in the upcoming session. Along with them, three new bills approved by the Cabinet recently will also be presented. The Rajasthan

Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Bill, 2025, tabled in the previous session, is set to be withdrawn and reintroduced with amendments. Additionally, drafts of some more bills may get Cabinet approval on Sunday. If that happens, the total number of bills lined up for the Assembly session could reach between 8 and 10, making it a crucial session for legislative business in Rajasthan.

Speaker Vasudev Devnani reviewed preparations for the session in a meeting with senior officials of the Assembly Secretariat. He directed them to ensure all necessary arrangements for the smooth conduct of the House. Devnani emphasised that officers should remain updated with rules, work in coordination, and address any technical difficulties faced by legislators. The previous session of the Rajasthan Legislative Assembly was held from January 31 to March 24, comprising 24 sittings. During this period, 12 Bills were introduced, of which 10 were passed.

#### Ration Dealer Suspension Not Lifted Despite HC

Bhilwara: The suspen-

sion of ration dealer Suresh Chandra Sharma. POS code 3752 of Paldi, continues despite clear orders from the Rajasthan High Court, raising concerns over administrative negligence. The District Logistics Officer had suspended Sharma's authority letter (No. 866/2005) on 5 March 2025 under order number Logistics/Case No. 03/2025. Sharma subsequently filed a petition in the Rajasthan High Court, Jodhpur (SB Civil Writ Petition No. 11751/2025), challenging the suspension. On 15 July 2025, the High Court stayed the suspension order of the District Logistics Officer. Following the court's order, Sharma submitted an application to the District Logistics Officer on 18 July 2025 requesting immediate cancellation of the suspension. When no action was taken, he approached the District Magistrate on 23 July 2025, providing a copy of the High Court order to compel compliance. On 19 August 2025, Additional District Collector Omprakash Mehra issued an order in Case No. 32/2025 directing the cancellation of Sharma's suspension. Despite these clear instructions, the District Logistics Officer has yet to comply, leaving the ration dealer in a state of uncertainty. Sharma has expressed his frustration over the continued disregard for judicial orders and called for immediate action to implement the court's

#### Woman Dies After Receiving Injections from Quack Doctor

Alwar: A 22-year-old pregnant woman tragically died after being treated by an unlicensed practitioner in the Gopalgarh area of Bharatpur district. The woman, identified as Rukhsana, had been suffering from health issues for three days. Initially admitted to Alwar Women's Hospital, she did not show improvement. Her family then approached a quack named Akram near their village, who administered multiple injections. Following this, her condition worsened, and she was brought back to Alwar Women's Hospital, where she succumbed despite medical treatment. Rukhsana's family has filed a dowry harassment against her in-laws. According to Farukh, a resident of Salahedi village, Nuh district, Haryana, his daughters Rukhsana and Sahista were married about three years ago to Tariq Muslim Jogi and Sajid of Gopalgarh. The family alleges that both daughters faced ongoing harassment from their inlaws over dowry issues. After a settlement, Rukhsana had returned to her marital home, but the tragic incident occurred while she was seven months pregnant.

Rajgarh (Alwar): A tragic road accident on Saturday evening at Moonpur village's culvert on the Rajgarh-Alwar Mega Highway claimed the life of a young man, while two others sustained serious injuries when another bike was also hit.

According to Ramesh Chand, in-charge of Kothi Narayanpur police outpost, the accident occurred around 4 PM. The deceased, Rakesh Meena (25), son of Kaluram Meena of Dalalpura village, was riding his motorcycle from Rajgarh after completing some personal work when a Centra truck, driven recklessly, struck him. Rakesh sustained fatal injuries and died on the spot. His body was sent to Rajgarh CHC mortuary after being recovered by the police.

Another motorcycle, carrying Mohan Yogi, son of Narayan Yogi, and Jagdish, son of Chandar Meena, both from Kovda and Gumanpura villages of Sikrai Tehsil, was also hit in the incident. The two sustained severe injuries and were treated at Rajgarh hospital. Mohan Yogi's condition was critical, leading to his referral to Alwar for further treatment.

The truck involved in the accident was immediately seized and parked at Kothi Narayanpur police outpost. A report has been filed at Rajgarh police station, and the police have begun an investigation into the incident. The postmortem of the deceased has been conducted, and the body has been handed over to the family.

#### Tripura Rolls Out PVC Ration Cards for PDS Beneficiaries

Agartala: The Tripura government has begun distributing consumerfriendly \*\*PVC ration cards\*\* to beneficiaries of the Public Distribution System (PDS), replacing old paper booklets with digital-ready durable. cards to ensure greater transparency and efficiency, officials said on Saturday. Tripura is the first state in the Northeast to introduce PVC ration cards and also the first to install PoS (Point of Sale) machines to enable their use. When swiped at ration shops, the cards automatically update connected databases, helping prevent irregularities. According to the Food and Civil Supplies Department, out of 9.91 lakh family ration card holders in viding Rs. 5,000 to each

PVC cards will be issued in the first phase. The remaining beneficiaries will receive them once their e-KYC (electronic Know Your Customer) formalities are completed. Distribution delays, officials said, are largely due to Aadhaar and residential proof issues or beneficiaries shifting back to their native places.

The new PVC ration cards are designed like voter ID or Aadhaar cards, making them longlasting, waterproof, and resistant to damage even during the rainy season. They also aim to reduce corruption and improve consumer convenience. 
## Over 2 lakh voters in Bihar filed objections on draft voter list

Patna: Preparations for the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections have gained momentum with large-scale participation in the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the voter list.

According to the Election Commission, so far 2,27,636 voters have filed claims and objections against entries in the draft voter list.

Among them, 29,872 applications have been filed for the inclusion of the names in the electoral rolls, while 1,97,764 applications were filed for the exclusion of names from the voter lists. The election commission has disposed of 33,771 applications in the last 7 days.

youth above 18 years have submitted Form-6 applica-

tions to get their names en- filed the maximum 118 rolled in the voter lists.

According to an official of the ECI, this indicates strong interest among young voters in participating in the democratic process.

If approved, over 13 lakh new names will be added to the electoral rolls this year. The Election Commission claims 61,248 applications were disposed of in the last 7 days. The Commission's report also highlights the role of Booth Level Agents (BLAs) appointed by political parties.

1,60,813 BLAs from 12 political parties are actively engaged across the state to assist voters in corrections and new registrations. Among them, CPIML BLAs

claims and objections, while RJD agents submitted 10 forms till Saturday.

Among the 118 claims and objections of CPI ML, 15 applications were filed for the inclusion of names in the electoral rolls, while 103 applications were filed for the exclusion from the voter lists. Officials said that such efforts by political parties, voters, and the Commission are making the revision process more transparent and error-free. Earlier, nearly 65 lakh names were deleted from the rolls during special intensive revision drives to remove ineligible or duplicate entries. The last date of filing the claims and objec-

### **India to Build All Future Warships Domestically: Rajnath Singh**

#### Court Strikes Down Most of Trump's Reciprocal Tariffs

Washington: In a setback to U.S. President Donald Trump, a federal appeals court struck down most of the administration's global reciprocal tariffs. In its ruling, the court ruled that President Trump did not have the "power to impose tariffs." Hours after the ruling President Trump stated that he would approach the Supreme Court on the ruling.

"The statute bestows significant authority on the President to undertake a number of actions in response to a declared national emergency, but none of these actions explicitly include the power to impose tariiis, auties, or the like, or the power to tax," it said.

The ruling stopped the order until October 14 to provide time to the administration to seek legal



recourse in the Supreme Court. However, U.S. tariffs on steel and aluminium, which were enacted through a different legal authority, would stay in place. Remarking on the President's use of the 1977 International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) to impose "reciprocal" tariffs, the court said it did not give Trump "unlimited authority to impose tariffs."

"The statute neither mentions tariffs (or any of its synonyms) nor has procedural safeguards that contain clear limits short of implementing on the President's power to impose tariffs," the court mentioned in its

#### India prevents global crisis by purchasing Russian oil, keeps markets stable

**Growing India** 

New Delhi: As allegations fly thick and fast over India extending a financial lifeline to Russia and becoming a laundering hub, the reality is that by purchasing Russian energy, New Delhi has prevented a global crisis by keeping global markets stable and inflation under control for itself and for the world.

Russia supplies nearly 10 per cent of world oil. If India stopped buying. crude could hit \$200 a barrel. By keeping oil flowing, India stabilised markets and helped global citizens. US Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen and others have already praised India's role towards this. India is not using US dollars from trade to buy Russian oil as purchases are routed through traders in third countries and settled in currencies like AED. At no point did the US government ask India to stop buying. India's trade is fully legitimate and within G7

and EU price-cap rules. There is no black market either. Russian oil is



not sanctioned like Iranian or Venezuelan oil. It is sold under a price-cap system designed by the West to prevent profiteering. If the US wanted to ban Russian oil, it would have sanctioned it. It did not because it needs Russian oil in the market.

India also cut fuel prices for its citizens even as global oil spiked to \$137 a barrel. State-run oil firms took losses of Rs 21,000 crore, while government taxed exports to prevent profiteering. India's imports prevented a global spike and cushioned inflation for everyone.

The country has been the world's 4th-largest refiner for decades. Refining crude and exporting fuels is how the global system works. After banning Russian crude, Europe itself relied on Indian diesel and jet fuel. That is stabilisation, not laundering.

Taking to social media platform X, PM Modi shared the essence of the discussion: "Thank President Zelensky for his

The involvement of Pakistan through its Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) in training and radicalising Rohingya armed groups has raised security concerns for the region. Reports indicate that Pakistani military officers have visited the 10th Infantry Division in Ramu and the 66th Infantry Division in Rangpur, strengthening ties



with local militias

In December 2024, the Rohingya Solidarity Organisation (RSO) joined the 'Four Brothers Alliance'—a coalition including ARSA, Rohingva Islami Mahaz, Arakan National Defence Force

(ANDF), and Arakan Rohingya Army (ARA)-ending prior internal conflicts and consolidating strength within refugee camps. Bangladesh Army is reportedly training Rohingva cadres to counter the Arakan Army

junta. Training centres are located in Mymensingh, Cox's Bazar, and Bagerhat, with ISI support in Naikhongchhari and Brahmanbaria.

The Arakan Army has seized control of 14 of 17 townships in Rakhine, representing nearly 80 percent of the region, and has been enforcing conscription for adults up to 45 years under its National Defence Emergency Provision. The group has been accused of anti-Rohingya violence and spreading hate speech. Bangladesh's planned UN-supported Rakhine Humanitarian Corridor (RHC) has been shelved, with aid now delivered through channels approved by

in collaboration with the ruling Dhaka. While the US supports a safe zone for Rohingyas, Bangladesh maintains control over its implementation. Amid the humanitarian emergency, Dhaka is pushing for dignified repatriation of Rohingyas, although the Arakan Army remains non-

#### Man Killed in Animal **Grazing Dispute**

Kushinagar: A violent dispute over animal grazing in Semra village under Kubersthan police station in Kushinagar district, Uttar Pradesh, ended in tragedy on Friday evening when a local man was brutally killed. The victim, Utkarsh Singh (40), son of Indrajit Singh, who serves as the district co-convener of the RSS, was attacked by a group of local men following an argument over livestock grazing in a field.

According to police and eyewitnesses, Utkarsh Singh went to the field after receiving information about animals grazing there. A dispute ensued with a family residing in a nearby hut, which escalated into a violent assault. Four men, identified as sons of Kanhai Yaday from the same village, reportedly chased Utkarsh into the village carrying sickles, sticks,

and rods. They repeatedly struck him on the head. face, eves, and other parts of his body, and continued to hold him down even after he fell to the ground. Evewitnesses stated that the attackers also gouged his eyes and cut his ears before police arrived at the scene.

Utkarsh was rushed to Padrauna Medical College in critical condition, where doctors declared him dead on arrival. Police have taken three of the accused into custody, while the fourth is still at

Kushinagar CO Dr. Ajay Kumar Singh confirmed that the police inspected the site and recorded statements from the victim's family. Based on the FIR filed by Indrajit Singh, a case has been registered against the four men-Satchidanand Yadav, Srinivas Yadav, Devendra Yadav, and Gyan Yadav-for murder. Investigation is ongoing.

Photographs and videos shared by local observers show coal spilling from open wagons onto railway tracks, creating hazardous conditions. Labor organizations and social groups have highlighted that such transportation methods increase the likelihood of accidents along the routes

Safety concerns extend beyond environmental issues. Social organizations have pointed out that coal theft is more likely when transported openly and that the pres-

ence of overhead hightension lines along the railway routes poses an additional life-threatening danger. Residents and local groups have stressed the urgent need for strict adherence to regulations to prevent potential mishaps.

Experts have called for rigorous enforcement of environmental and safety norms, suggesting that covering all coal shipments with tarpaulins can mitigate pollution, reduce accidents, and protect public health. They argue that proper monitoring by management and railway authorities is essential to ensure compliance with Supreme Court directives and maintain safe transportation stand-

## Centre Held Responsible for Punjab's Worst Flood in 37 Years

Chandigarh: Punjab Water Resources Minister Barinder Kumar Goyal on Saturday came down heavily on the Union Government, holding it responsible for aggravating Punjab's worst flood in the last 37 years.

The Cabinet Minister said the timely release of water by the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) in June could have significantly reduced the devastation. He lamented that even as lakhs of people in Punjab continue to suffer, the Prime Minister has not made a single statement on the crisis, let alone extend any support to the state.

Raising concern over Haryana's approach, the Minister alleged that while Harvana, on one hand, sends letters offering help, on the other, it has also communicated that Punjab be left to drown by reducing Haryana's share of water flow during this monsoon from 7,900 cusecs to



6,250 cusecs to protect its canal systems and population, thereby leaving Punjab to its fate.

He added that despite repeated requests, the BBMB failed to release adequate water from dams in June, which could have helped mitigate the impact of floods in Puniab. The minister further disclosed that a private company, Level 19 Biz Private Limited, which had been engaged in 2024 to assess the structural strength of Madhopur headworks

gates, wrongly certified them as capable of withstanding 6.25 lakh cusecs of water. However, the gates failed to manage even half the certified capacity, leading to their collapse and the tragic death of a department employee.

Goyal said this grave lapse has not only exposed negligence but also worsened the crisis. A strict notice has been served to the company, and punitive action is being initiated. He said that due to heavy rainfall in Himachal Pradesh

and Jammu and Kashmir, coupled with the convergence of water from khuds and nullahs into the regulated discharge from the state's rivers, Punjab is witnessing one of the most devastating floods in its history, far worse than the catastrophic floods of 1988.

The Minister pointed out that although only 2.15 lakh cusecs of water were released into the Ravi river from the Ranjit Sagar Dam, the additional flow from khuds and nullahs of adjoining states turned the

situation into massive destruction. He said that the regulated discharge aggravated by the sudden convergence of floodwaters from khuds and nullahs has surpassed all previous records, causing widespread devastation across seven districts of the state.

Goyal revealed that in

1988, the Ravi had carried 11.20 lakh cusecs of water. whereas this year it has reached 14.11 lakh cusecs. Out of this, around 2.15 lakh cusecs were released from the Ranjit Sagar Dam while the remaining flow came from khuds, nullahs and catchment areas of Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir and Punjab.  $\hbox{``This unprecedented surge'}\\$ directly impacted three districts with waters of the Ravi, while four other districts suffered heavy losses due to floods from the Beas and the Sutlej rivers, inflicting massive damage to standing crops, livestock and habitation," he said.

Highlighting the relief and rescue measures, the Cabinet Minister informed that the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann-led government ensured the timely evacuation and protection of lives. Over 11,330 people were rescued and shifted to 87 relief camps where food, shelter and medical care were provided. Nearly 110 people were airlifted from marooned areas with assistance from NDRF, SDRF and Army

"The foremost priority of the Punjab Government was to save every life. From senior district officials to patwaris and volunteers, every arm of the government worked on the ground with the people,' he added. The Water Resources Minister also clarified that extensive evacuation of livestock has been carried out. Market committee sheds and relief shelters were used to accommodate animals in affected areas of Ferozepur and Fazilka, with large quantities of fodder supplied by the government and voluntary organisations.

### Two battalions of disaster relief would be established

Chandigarh: Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Saturday said that two battalions of the Haryana Disaster Relief Force would be established to handle exigencies and assist people. He said that the foundation stone of the upcoming Fire and Disaster Training Institute in Jind district would soon be laid. The Chief Minister was reviewing the functioning of the Fire and Emergency Services and the Revenue and Disaster Management Department with officials.

CM Saini said that for the renewal of fire safety certificates, the no-objection certificate (NOC) would be granted automatically upon application. However, after renewal, officials would conduct random checks within 15 days. The Chief Minister instructed that accountabilitv and time limits should be fixed at every level, and the fire NOC should be linked



also directed strict action against officials and emplovees who keep NOC applications pending. The Chief Minister directed officials to purchase two fire engines equipped with advanced 101-meter technology soon. In addition, 13 hydraulic platform fire vehicles of different heights and 250 firefighting vehicles for block-level use will also be procured. The capacity of water pipes in fire engines will be increased up to 1,000 metres so that they can be effectively used in crowded areas during emergencies. The Chief Minister instructed that the Fire and Disaster

should function as per NDRF (National Disaster Response Force) standards and provide training for dealing with disasters such as earthquakes, fires, and floods. He also directed officials to collect data of all swimmers in the state and create a dedicated portal.

The Chief Minister said as per the Ministry of Home Affairs guidelines, mapping had been done for setting up new fire stations, and under this plan, 59 new fire stations will be opened in the state. He also directed officials to purchase 10 firefighting robots soon, which will be used initially on a pilot basis.

#### Government to Waive Farm Loan Interest

By citing such sensational figures, what is Bhagwat trying to prove—that the idea of Sanatan Hindu thought is so prehistoric? Such antiquity would likely belong to a dark age devoid of education, language, writing,

quoting, then? Reports by Freedom House have shown that where the "Hindu" (idea and individual) is dominant, democracy is 100% stable and vibrant. Where Christians are dominant, democracy is about 50% stable. Where Muslims are in majority or hold dominance, democracy tends to be unstable. Why did Bhagwat not cite this theory?

The RSS is celebrating its centenary, which is natural. Its chief is delivering such lectures across the country. ## 'MICROPLASTICS' HAVE BECOME PART OF NOT ONLY AQUATIC LIFE, BUT ALSO OUR FOOD CHAIN



cientists worldwide have long warned about the deteriorating state of the oceans, but human negligence, overexploitation, and selfish practices continue to suffocate marine life. Over three billion people depend on marine organisms for their livelihoods, yet insufficient measures have been taken to preserve this vital resource. Illegal fishing, plastic pollution, and climate change are accelerating the

loss of marine biodiversity, demanding immediate global attention to safeguard the future of humanity and the oceans.

Rising sea temperatures and plastic pollution have intensified the crisis. The Mediterranean, for instance, is warming twenty percent faster than the global average, despite the Paris Agreement's target to curb global temperature rise. Currently, over sixty percent of the marine ecosystem faces degradation, and plastic pollution is projected to nearly double by 2040, reaching 23-37 million tonnes annually. Microplastics have infiltrated water and marine life, compounding the problem.

Amid these challenges, researchers at Tokyo University's Riken Center for Emergent Matter have developed a biodegradable



plastic alternative. This new material, as strong as conventional plastic, disintegrates upon contact with saltwater into harmless components, preventing the creation of microplastics. While not yet commercially available, this innovation offers hope for reducing oceanic plastic

Global organizations aim to conserve thirty percent of the oceans by 2030, aligning with the Paris Climate Agreement's 1.5°C goal. Technical solutions,

such as phased plastic removal and recycling, must complement ambitious climate plans. Coral reefs, which support roughly twenty-five percent of marine species, are bleaching at alarming rates due to rising temperatures. In the Caribbean, Indian Ocean, and Pacific regions, widespread coral degradation threatens fisheries, tourism, and coastal livelihoods.

Oceans also absorb nearly ninety percent of greenhouse gas-induced heat, mitigating climate disasters. However, overfishing and mismanagement continue to strain marine ecosystems. In response, the World Trade Organization previously restricted subsidies to curb excessive fishing, and international treaties now aim to protect marine life in global waters. Yet, experts argue that policies alone cannot reverse ecological damage; enforcement and adequate funding are essential.

Annual investment of \$175 billion is needed to conserve oceans and marine ecosystems, but current funding falls drastically short at just \$10 billion. Each year, oceans absorb approximately 12 million metric tonnes of plastic. Fish stocks, once at 90 percent of safe biological levels in 1970, have fallen to 62 percent in 2021. While international conferences since 2017 have produced resolutions on ocean conservation, progress remains limited.

The Third UN Ocean Conference, held in France on June 11, 2025, highlighted that over a third of global fish stocks are being overexploited. Unsustainable fishing practices, climate change, and poor management continue to diminish oceanic biodiversity. Comprehensive reevaluation of global fisheries policies is urgently needed to meet the target of conserving thirty percent of marine areas and aquatic

life by 2030. Addressing this crisis requires political will, scientific innovation, and adequate economic resources. Technical advances, such as biodegradable plastics and improved fishing techniques, must be scaled globally. Coordinated international efforts can mitigate climate impacts, reduce pollution, and restore marine biodiversity. Without urgent action, the oceans' capacity to sustain life and protect humanity from climate hazards will be irreversibly compromised.

## US TARIFFS IMPACT BANARASI SAREE EXPORTS, INDUSTRY FACES CHALLENGES

Varanasi: The world-famous Banarasi saree and silk industry is facing a severe impact due to tariffs imposed by the US. Following the imposition of tariffs, large orders from the US are being cancelled, and foreign traders have started returning shipments, say traders

According to the Varanasi Textile Industry Association, if this situation persists, the city could suffer losses of up to Rs 300 crore annually. This crisis has put the livelihoods of thousands of artisans at



risk, and the industry is now staring at large-scale unemployment.

Rajan Bahl, vice president of Banarasi Textile Industry Association, stated: "Exports of Banarasi sarees will decline by 15 to

20 per cent due to these tariffs. Handloom products will be the most affected. Though the current losses may appear small, the future impact will be severe. Every year, exports worth Rs 200 to Rs 300 crore were sent to the US, which is now under threat. Orders are being cancelled, and no new orders are coming in. I firmly believe this is not a minor loss; it is a major blow to Banaras and its industry. Orders are being cancelled, and we cannot expect fresh orders going forward."

He further added that the number of handlooms is already decreasing, and these tariffs will only accelerate the decline. He appealed to the government for immediate intervention to save the industry.

Local saree Sarvesh Kumar Srivastava said: "The tariffs have seriously impacted our business. Recently, goods worth Rs 10 lakh were returned. The weavers' livelihoods are in jeopardy. Finished products have been put on hold, and payments are stuck. I employ 20 workers, and holding Rs 20 lakh worth of goods has caused significant losses."

He explained that traders, already facing economic challenges, are now under increased pressure due to the tariffs. Srivastava demanded that the government exempt handloom and handicraft sectors from GST. "Removing the 5 per cent GST on handloom and handicrafts would provide relief to the industry. It would boost demand in the domestic market and attract the middle class back to Banarasi sarees," he said. He added: "I believe GST exemption could bring a revival in the industry, providing support to weavers and traders alike. The tariffrelated crisis has not only caused economic losses but also endangered the livelihoods of thousands of artisans and their families. In a video shared by Modi Story, a popular X account, chronicling the Prime Minister's leadership journey, Baba Kalyani recalled a memorable moment from one of PM Modi's earlier visits to Ja-

Then leading a delegation of Indian industrialists, the Prime Minister displayed a symbolic gesture designed to connect deeply with Japanese business culture, which values unity and collective purpose.

"We were around 30 to 40 Indian business leaders in a room with more than 300 Japanese CEOs," Kalyani

"Narendra Modi turned to us and said, 'Stand up. Tell them that India is



ready for business. That we have a red carpet ready for you."

The simple yet impactrui gesture -- where the entire Indian delegation stood up in unison and extended an open invitation to invest in India -- struck a chord with the Japanese audience.

Kalyani noted that PM Modi had keenly observed how collective action and symbolism are deeply embedded in Japanese society. and he used that knowledge to send a strong, unifying message of intent and

hospitality.

"It was a moment of cultural alignment. The Japanese saw seriousness, commitment, and unity. That's what left an impression," Kalvani added.

Since then, substantial Japanese investments have steadily poured into India.

This anecdote, now gaining traction online, is being seen as another example of PM Modi's strategic acumen and cultural intelligence in diplomacy -- traits he has consistently displayed, from his days as Chief Minister of Gujarat to his current role as Prime Minister of India.

PM Modi's most recent visit to Japan -- where he held summit talks with his counterpart Shigeru Ishiba -- marked a further deepening of the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership.

Key announcements included: Japan's investment target of 10 trillion yen (nearly Rs 60,000 crore) in India over the next decade, a new defence cooperation framework, and a 10-year roadmap to scale up economic engagement.

## INDIA'S PASSENGER VEHICLE SALES CROSS 10-LAKH MARK IN Q1 FY26

New Delhi: Over 10 lakh passenger vehicles were sold in India in the April-June period, with Maharashtra topping the sales chart, according to latest data from industry body Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM).

From April to June, 10.12 lakh passenger vehicles were sold in the country, and the western zone topped sales with 3.21 lakh units.

As many as 1.19 lakh units were sold in Maharashtra in the June quarter. Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Karnataka, and Haryana followed in the sales chart compiled by SIAM.

In the two-wheeler segment, 46.75 lakh units were sold in the country during this period, with sales in western states reaching

14.19 lakh units, the industry body said. Uttar Pradesh led in two-wheeler sales, totalling 8.18 lakh units, followed by Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Bi-

In the commercial vehicle segment, Maharashtra led the space with sales of 32,000 units in the June quarter. Overall, 2.23 lakh

commercial vehicles were sold in the country during the period.

Sales in the three-wheeler segment reached 1.65 lakh units during this period, with Uttar Pradesh leading sales with 21,000 units, followed by Maharashtra, Gujarat, Karnataka, and Telangana, according to SIAM.

In July 2025, passenger vehicle dispatches from companies to dealers declined marginally to 3,40,772 units, down from 3,41,510 units a year earlier.

In the upcoming Goods and Services Tax (GST) reforms, the Centre is expected to lower the tax on entry-level passenger vehicles and two-wheelers to 18 per cent, making them more affordable ahead of Diwali.

Currently, all passenger vehicles powered by combustion engines are subject to a GST of 28 per cent, plus a compensation cess ranging from 1 per cent to 22 per cent, based on engine capacity, length, and body

Mandaviva underlined that sports manufacturing has now been formally included in the Allocation of Business Rules. 1961, giving the sector national policy status. Stressing self-reliance, he said, "From 1% global share now, we aim for 25% by 2036.
